



Advanced Course in Shopping Centre Leadership

Presented by the Department of Construction Economics, University of Pretoria, in collaboration with South African Council of Shopping Centres (SACSC)

The **Advanced Course in Shopping Centre Leadership** is a correspondence course, presented in collaboration with the South African Council of Shopping Centres. It is designed to enhance the managerial and business acumen of senior managers in the shopping centre industry and it provides you with the skills to strategically position shopping centres as a vital component of the retail and property industry. The Advanced Programme in Shopping Centre Leadership is a progression from the course in Shopping Centre Management.

Course content

You will complete six assignments during the year, and towards the end of the year, attend a three-day session where you will meet the lecturers and discuss problems. A four-hour written examination follows the contact sessions.

Learning outcomes

After successfully completing this course, you will have the skills required to strategically position shopping centres as a vital component of the retail and property industry.

This course is ideal for you if you are shopping centre management personnel, architects, town planners, marketing personnel, legal advisors, engineers, accountants and retail brokers.
