The **Afrikaans Language Course for Beginners** provides you with a sufficient foundation in the grammar and vocabulary of Afrikaans to express yourself comfortably in both social and business contexts. The course equips you with the necessary language skills to read, write and understand Afrikaans through various practical exercises – even if you have no or little prior knowledge of the language – and the confidence to partake in dialogue, one-on-one interactions and group discussions. An emphasis is placed on fluency and grammatical correctness in both oral and written work, while aiming to improve proficiency with the help of audio-visual material and exercises.

Course content

- Fluency and grammatical correctness in both oral and written work.
- Listening, vocabulary, grammar and independent oral and written exercises.

- express yourself in Afrikaans through oral exercises
- hold dialogues, have group interaction and make individual presentations
- read, write and understand Afrikaans through various exercises, and
- understand the social and political context of Afrikaans and to give advice on appropriate language use for different social and business contexts.
