The **English as a Foreign Language (EFL)** course offers international students the chance to learn English at one of the top universities in South Africa. Students can become part of an exciting, vibrant campus and experience student life while improving their English skills.

The courses are based on international standards, and include lots of opportunities for you to immerse yourself in English. Make friends with South African students in your first week during a tour of the UP campus. Discover all the reasons why so many tourists visit Pretoria every year: the shopping centres, restaurants and clubs for those who enjoy the night life, the green spaces, parks and adventure trails for those who enjoy the outdoors, and the theatres and art galleries for those who enjoy culture. 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Learning outcomes

The EFL course aims to improve the basic English proficiency of international students from countries where English is not used as an official language.

Course details

Each course runs over 8 weeks (09:00 to 13:30, Monday to Friday), with 180 contact hours per course. A certificate is awarded on the successful completion of each course.

Who should enrol?

The courses are ideal for international students planning to enrol at an English-medium university or wanting to work in an English environment.

Course fees

R10 400. 00 per student (VAT Inclusive)

Includes course material, certificate fee and one local outing.

Admission requirements

Literacy in the student's mother tongue. Students will be given a proficiency test on arrival to confirm their level.

Assessment

To obtain a certificate issued by the University of Pretoria, candidates should successfully complete the in-class tests, and attend a minimum of 85% of the course.
